## **Punnapra South Fishing Village**

(Punnapura South Grama Panchayat - Ambalapuzha Block)

## A Brief Profile of the Punnapura South Fishing Village

Punnapra South fisheries village is spread over five wards of Punnapra South Gram Panchayat. The coastal wards of this village are 1, 12, 13, 14 and 16. The village has a total of 1540 houses and 1563 households are living there. Among them, 30 households are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 38.31 percent houses are pucca, 51.95 percent are semi-pucca and 9.74 percent houses are kachha houses. About 91.56 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 86.69 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (92.21 %) are electrified. It is noted that 490 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 26 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 6 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one sub centre and one ayurveda hospital. The village has one LP School and one UP School. Fourteen anganawadis are functioning in this village and seven of them are functioning in own buildings. This village has a network of 20 roads of 14.02 Km length. The village has 133 street lights and 43 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 15 country fishing boats and 3 mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 8 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one fish landing centre. The village has three ice plants and one market. The village has coastal line of 3.20 Km, out of which 3.10 Km is protected. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.
