## **Purathur Fishing Village**

(Purathur Grama Panchayat - Thiroor Block)

## A Brief Profile of the Purathur Fishing Village

Purathur fisheries village is spread over three wards of Purathur Gram Panchayat. The coastal wards of this village are 1, 17 and 18. The village has a total of 1147 houses and 1214 households are living there. Among them, 78 are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 59.29 percent houses are pucca, 30.51 percent are semi-pucca and 10.20 percent houses are kachha houses. About 81.43 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 84.57 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (84.13 %) are electrified. It is noted that 418 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 57 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 20 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one CHC. The village has two UP schools. Seven anganawadis are functioning in this village and five of them are functioning in its own building. This village has 11 roads of 7.655 km length and 0.42 Km drainage. The village has 43 street lights and only 16 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 83 country fishing boats and 7 mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 72 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one fish market. The village has coastal line of 5 Km and out which 4.20 Km is protected. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.

The results of situation analysis and needs and requirements are presented in Tables 7 and 8 while the financial requirements are given in Table 9.
