## Vizhinjam South Fishing Village

(Vizhinjam GP- Athiyanoor Block)

## Brief Profile of Vizhinjam South fishing village

Vizhinjam South fisheries village is spread over six wards of Vizhinjam Gram Panchayath. The coastal wards of this village are 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18. The village has a total of 2807 houses and 2861 households are living there. Among them, 59 households are landless or presently living as a joint family. Regarding the housing situation in the village, it is noted that 50.66 percent houses are pucca, 43.50 percent are semi-pucca and 5.84 percent houses are kachha houses. About 95.40 percent of the existing houses in the village have sanitary toilets. Safe drinking water is available to 94.73 percent of the existing houses. Most of the houses in the village (94.48 %) are electrified. It is noted that 1526 persons from the fisher folk community are insured with the Fisheries Board (Matsya Board). And 68 persons are covered under the old age pension scheme and 22 persons are covered under widow pension scheme during 2007-08 in this village.

Regarding the community specific facilities, this village has one sub centre. The village has three LP schools, one UP School and one higher Secondary School. Ten anganawadis are functioning in this village and five of them are functioning in rented building. This village has a network of 10 roads of length 8.70 Km, 5 Km drainage and five culverts. The village has 247 street lights and 230 of them are functional. About the fisheries specific infrastructure and facilities, it is noted that 198 country fishing boats and 9 mechanized boats are available in this fisheries village. And a total of 124 kerosene permits are issued to the fisher folk in this. The village has one harbour, one landing centre, eight ice plants and one market. The village has an unprotected coastal length of 2.70 Km. Consumption of liquor and narcotic drugs are moderate in this village.
